The faculty members are encouraged to do research under FDP of UGC. Major and minor research projects are taken up by faculty members. Student projects are also taken up by the institution.

New books were added to the college library. A new building was constructed for the college women's hostel. Laboratory facilities were improved.

However, more teachers are entrusted with the responsibility of sharing one paper owing to vast syllabus.
