16. Details of NSS.

The National Service Scheme of Bishop Moore College has two units. Unit A was led by Dr. Brijithlal N.D. and Unit B by Ms. Linda E. Jacob during the academic year 2015-16. 216 students were enrolled as volunteers. Throughout the year, the units had been very busy with its manifold activities. Weekly meetings were conducted every Wednesday and Thursday during the lunch break from 12:50pm till 1:30pm. b) **A brief note on College Planning forum and its activities**

The Governing Council, IQAC, Planning Board,Staff Council and Departmental Staff meeting put forward necessary proposals for infrastructure development, upgradation of teaching learning activities, etc. The Principal convenes the College Level Monitoring Committee (CLMC), comprising the Heads of all departments and the elected members of the Council. The Committee discusses the ways and means to effectively implement the Curriculum, keeping in mind the exam schedule, the schedule for co-curricular activities, and in accordance with the rules and regulations stipulated by the University.

The next step is where the Heads of the various departments meet with the faculty of their respective departments in Department Level Monitoring Committee (DLMC) meetings and the action plan for the semester is charted out. Course coordinators are selected and entrusted with the task of overseeing the proper implementation of the curriculum by setting a monthly plan, wherein the syllabus is distributed evenly within a semester. The college supplements the curriculum by conducting seminars, workshops, exhibitions, quiz programmes and innovative teaching methods.

It was suggested in the CLMC meeting at the beginning of 2015-16 that the curriculum prescribed by the University should be supplemented by conducting seminars, workshops, exhibitions, quiz programmes and innovative teaching methods. The departments have implemented this and since then, a total of 11 workshops/seminars, 7 endowment lectures, and several quiz programmes have been organized.

### c) A brief note of College Union and its activities

The College Union is the students' body which is constituted as per University regulations. Parliamentary system of election is followed for the election of representatives.

College Union Election 2015 was held on 4<sup>th</sup> December, 2015. Elections were notified as per University schedule in the college notice board.
