20. COLLEGE PLANNING FORUM AND ITS ACTIVITIES

2. Physics Computer & Networking Centre

An Air conditioned computer centre with 25 Desktop Computers, LAN, Internet facility, , is available for Add on Course (Web Designing & Office Automation) students. Two units of 5 KVA battery is installed to ensure steady power supply.

3.Commerce Computer Lab

The Commerce Computer lab is equipped with 16 Desktop Computers, LAN,5 KVA Battery and Ceiling Mount LCD projector. The Lab is accessible to the B. Com (Computer Applications) students.
