The programme was highly beneficial for commerce students and contributed significantly to enhancing their practical knowledge and financial awareness.



National Mathematics Day celebration 2025: Department of Mathematics



The key event was an online invited talk titled “An Introduction to Fluid Dynamics” by Dr. Huldah Samuel, Head of the Department of Mathematics at Madras Christian College, Chennai, held via Google Meet at 6:30 PM. Additionally, the day featured an exhibition on the life and contributions of Srinivasa Ramanujan and an Inter-Departmental Puzzle Competition conducted at the Department of Mathematics at 10:00 AM and 1:00 PM, respectively. Lecture on "Magic moments in Quantum Mechanics": Department of Physics

As part of the Quantum Centenary Celebrations, the Department of Physics, Bishop Moore College, Mavelikara, organised a special lecture titled "Magic Moments in Quantum Mechanics" on 18 December 2025 at 2.30 pm. The programme was conducted at the e-learning room of the Department of Physics with the objective of commemorating the centenary of quantum theory and enhancing students' understanding of the subject.

The lecture was delivered by Dr. Tharanath, Assistant Professor of Physics, Aquinas College, Edakochi, who is well known for his expertise in theoretical and modern physics. In his presentation, Dr. Tharanath discussed several landmark discoveries and "magic moments" in the development of Quantum Mechanics, explaining complex ideas such as wave-particle duality, quantization, uncertainty principle, and quantum superposition in a clear and simplified manner. He also emphasized the relevance of quantum concepts in contemporary science and technology, including semiconductors, lasers, and emerging quantum technologies. The session was attended by students of M.Sc. Physics Semester I, M.Sc. Physics Semester VI, and Fourth Semester FYUGP. The lecture was

highly interactive, with students actively participating by raising questions and engaging in discussions. Dr. Tharanath patiently clarified doubts and encouraged students to think critically about the conceptual foundations of quantum theory.


