


An Evening of Poetic Essence


Poetry Cafe


The recitation session, featuring both established poets and budding talents, served as the heart of the program.

The Soul of Kerala







Hands-on Workshop on “Synthesis of Nanomaterials”



A Three-Day Hands-on Workshop on “Synthesis of Nanomaterials” was jointly organized by Bishop Moore College, TKM College of Arts and Science and University College in association with the Board of Studies, University of Kerala. The workshop aimed at familiarizing faculty members and students with the newly introduced course on Nanomaterials in the FYUGP curriculum, with special emphasis on the practical components included in the syllabus.

The programme was conducted on three different dates across the collaborating institutions: 28 January at Bishop Moore College, Mavelikara; 30 January at TKM College of Arts and Science, Kollam; and 02 February at University College, Thiruvananthapuram. The workshop focused primarily on providing hands-on training in the synthesis techniques of nanomaterials, enabling participants to gain practical exposure aligned with the updated curriculum requirements.

At Bishop Moore College, the sessions were led by Dr. Arun Aravind and Dr. Lija K. Joy, Assistant Professors of Physics, who provided detailed demonstrations and guided participants through various experimental procedures related to nanomaterial synthesis. The interactive sessions allowed participants to clarify conceptual doubts and strengthen their practical skills.



The workshop was sponsored by Holmarc Optomechatronics. A total of 25 faculty members from various colleges in Alappuzha District actively participated in the programme at Bishop Moore College. The initiative significantly contributed to enhancing academic preparedness and practical competence among faculty members, ensuring effective implementation of the FYUGP curriculum in affiliated institutions.
