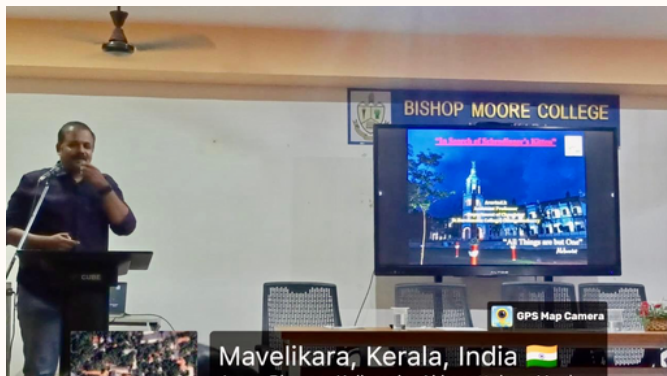
Counselling session, “Boundaries, Balance & Self-Worth: Building Healthier Connections”: Women Cell

Day 01: Mole Day Intro Video “Measuring a Mole, Understanding the Whole”: As part of the Mole Day celebrations, the Department of Chemistry organized an introductory activity on 23 October 2025, led by the S1 M.Sc. Analytical Chemistry students. To mark the occasion, the students weighed five different compounds, each equivalent to one mole, using materials from the chemistry laboratory. The students also created a short educational video showcasing the weighing process along with concise explanations and basic facts about the mole concept. The video served as an informative and creative introduction to the series of events organized for Mole Week 2025.

Day 02: Chem Charades, “Where Chemistry Met Creativity”: An interactive event, “Chem Charades,” was held on 27 October 2025 as part of Mole Week celebrations. The program, conducted by S1 M.Sc. Analytical Chemistry students, aimed to make chemistry learning more engaging and enjoyable. 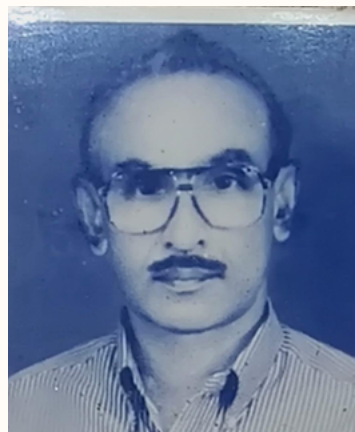
PG Entrance Coaching: Department of Mathematics

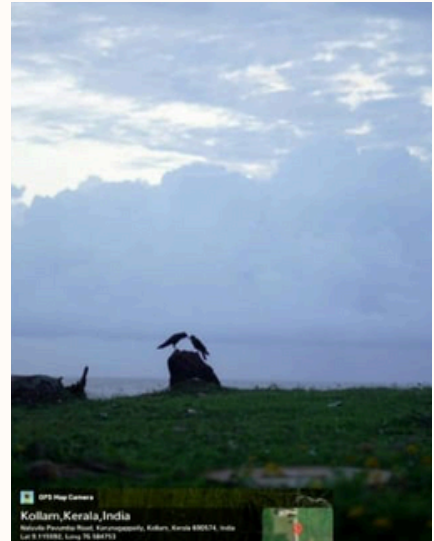
