EQUAL OPPORTUNITY & DIVYANGJAN CELL

Equal Opportunity and Divyangjan cell is basically meant for creating equal opportunities and access to all disadvantaged and differently-abled students with respect to admission and their academic progression. Cell strives to create a motivating environment that enriches the higher education learning experiences of disadvantaged and differently-abled persons.

The activities of the cell are monitored by a Committee consisting of Teaching and Non-teaching Staff with a Permanent Faculty Member as Convener.

Objectives:

- 1. To create special facilities such as ramps, rails and special toilets and make other necessary changes to suit the special needs of differently— abled students such as special aids and appliances for their daily functioning.
- 2. To provide special learning assistive devices to help differently- abled students enrolled for higher education. Availability of devices such as computers with screen reading software, low-vision aids and scanners in the institutes would enrich the educational and facility of Readers to differently abled students.
- 3. Setting up Special Guidance Centres in Educational Institutes for differently abled students.

Facilities for Persons with Disabilities in the Campus:

- (i) Students with Disabilities are admitted without discrimination. Education and opportunities for sports and recreation activities for such students are equally provided with others. The reservation policy for admission is also strictly followed.
- (ii) All buildings and hostels have ramps. All buildings in the campus have toilets for persons with disabilities.
- (iii) Reasonable accommodation facilities exist for ladies according to the individual's requirements
- (iv) Scribe Facility is provided for appearing for University Examination. Students with disabilities are provided with the facility to authorise any other student to borrow books from the library on his/her behalf.
- (v)Library upgradation including special facilities including Brailie books, softwares etc for students with disabilities are under progress.
